


ELABORATION OF STANDARDS

Standards Elaboration Process

Once the project document is prepared and the CAC (taking into account the advice of the CCEXEC) has agreed that new work should begin on a standard:



The CAC should agree which Committee is responsible for developing the standard and guiding it through the 5/8 step procedure.


An important stage occurs immediately after the project document is prepared, i.e. a country or group of countries must prepare a first draft of the standard to be considered through the step process.



The Eight-Step Procedure



Eight-Step Procedure




- > The normal elaboration process follows eight distinct steps, involving two rounds of comments by members.
- > A decision may be taken at step 5 to omit the second round of comments (steps 6 and 7).
- > It can be decided at the beginning to follow the accelerated 5-Step Procedure with only one round of government comments.

The Eight-Step Procedure (2)




Standards Elaboration – At A Glance






The 5-Step Procedure



Delay in Advancing Standards





While every effort is made to advance standards in a timely manner through the relevant 8-step or 5-step procedure — it is important to note that standards may be returned to an earlier step.

Amendments

Amendments to the rules of procedure:

- usually do not go through the Codex step procedure; and
- do not require a project document.



✓ Proposed amendments are considered by the Codex Committee on General Principles, and recommendations for revision go from that committee to the Commission.
